

Featured Speakers

The Life and Times of Ben Franklin

Through simulation Bill Ochester brings history alive. Meet a famous colonial gentleman, Benjamin Franklin, explore his thoughts, share his observations and experience the essence of his person.



January 17th, 2006 marked the 300th birthday of Benjamin Franklin. Of all of our founding fathers, he most represented the common man. With no more than two years of formal education, Franklin founded a university and a hospital. He was our first postmaster general, founder of the first fire insurance company as well as a public lending library. Many of Franklin's inventions, from swim fins, to a flexible urinary catheter, to bifocals, were meant to add to the comfort and enjoyment of his fellow citizens.

Following his retirement in 1998 from a career as a physician's assistant in cardio-thoracic surgery, Bill Ochester expanded his lifelong interest in early American history. Bill has been on the interpretive staff at the National Constitution Center since its opening in July of 2003. He brings Franklin to life for local civic, fraternal and educational organizations in the Philadelphia region. *Bring your camera for a picture with Ben in the exhibit area following this session.*

Jane Koeckeritz, PhD, ANP, is Professor Emerita in

 Nursing at the University of Northern Colorado (UNC). She was selected recipient of this year's M. Lucile Harrison Award for Professional Excellence, UNC's top faculty honor. She is presently the Interim Director for the university's Center for the Enhancement of Teaching and Learning

with responsibilities to support the professional development of faculty, administrators, teaching assistants and staff in their innovative teaching and learning activities. She is certified as an Adult Nurse Practitioner and has taught in classrooms and online for undergraduate and graduate students. Her areas of expertise include nursing education and informat-

ics, adult health, physical assessment and pathophysiology. Dr. Koeckeritz has published on topics related to improving classroom interactivity, computer technology and online education. Her expertise has been recognized throughout the world by invitations to present workshops in Australia, New Zealand and Canada.

Pamela R. Jeffries, DNS, RN, FAAN, is Associate

Dean for Undergraduate Programs and an Associate Professor at the Indiana University School of Nursing (IUSON).



She has taught in the classroom, learning laboratory, and clinical setting with undergraduate and graduate nursing students for over 20 years.

Well-known for her use of simulation in nursing education, Dr. Jeffries is currently leading a three-year, National League for Nursing/Laerdal sponsored national multi-site, multi-method study on the use of simulations. This project uses high-fidelity mannequins to help learners develop clinical problem-solving skills in the safety of a simulated healthcare environment. Dr. Jeffries has also developed a "hyper-learning" design model to guide teachers in creating online courseware - a model that is being used in a collaborative effort with Clarian Health Partners, Inc., the American Association of Critical-Care Nurses and IUSON to design online courses to prepare nurses and nursing students across the U.S. in critical care. Dr. Jeffries is an excellent teacher, author, researcher and a trend setter, who continues to explore the most effective uses of information technology in facilitating, teaching and learning.


